Dear Governor Hogan:

The Board of Revenue Estimates submits to you revised general fund revenue estimates for fiscal year 2019 and the first official estimates for fiscal year 2020. We have reviewed the current estimate for fiscal year 2019 in light of the most recent economic data and developments, as well as revenue collections for fiscal year 2018. Based on our analysis, the Board submits a revised estimate of general fund revenues for fiscal year 2019 of \$18.088 billion and an estimate of \$18.678 billion for fiscal year 2020.

The Board and the Revenue Monitoring Committee will continue to meet and analyze revenue and economic trends in anticipation of December's estimates.
